



Major General Ronny Numa, Israeli Defense Forces (ret.), most recently served as head of the IDF Central Command, a position he held for three years. Maj Gen Numa previously served as head of the IDF Depth Corps, the umbrella command for IDF special forces units tasked with coordinating long-range special operations in order to, for example, prevent transfer of advanced weaponry to non-state armed terrorist organizations such as Hamas and Hezbollah. Prior positions in his over 30-year military career include: Commander, Joint Command; Commander of the Sinai (Armored) Division; Commander of the National Army Training Center; Commander of the Paratroopers Division; Personal Assistant to the Chief of IDF General Staff; Commander of Infantry Brigade; Commander of the Binyamin Wide Brigade; Commander of Battalion 202 Paratroopers; Commander of the Air Force Commando Unit, Shaldag; and Unit Commander, Duvdevan Unit.

The general holds a BA in Middle East and Science Studies from the Hebrew University of Jerusalem-Israel, 1997; an MA in economics and national security, from National Defense University (National Strategic Command College in the United States Department of Defense), Washington, 2012; and is a graduate of both the Advanced International Strategic Management Program (AMP-194) on behalf of the Business Administration School at Harvard-USA, 2018 and of the Directors Course, Lahav-Recanti, Tel Aviv University-Israel, 2018.
