Smoke-Free Campus Policy

Administrative policy announced August 6, 2021 and codified December 16, 2021.

Effective immediately.

A. Smoke-Free Campus

Southwestern Law School is a smoke-free campus and prohibits smoking, vaping, and the use of e-cigarettes and similar devices on campus, whether in campus buildings, residential facilities, or outdoor areas. In addition, smoking is not permitted within 25 feet of any campus entrance, operable windows, or intake vents or in vehicles parked on property owned or controlled by the Law School.

B. Definition of “Smoking”

“Smoking” means inhaling, exhaling, burning, or carrying any lighted or heated cigar, cigarette, cigarillo, pipe, hookah, joint, or any other lighted or heated tobacco, plant product, or other product—whether natural or synthetic—intended for inhalation—in any manner or in any form. “Smoking” also includes use of an electronic smoking device that creates an aerosol or vapor, in any manner or in any form, or the use of any oral smoking device for the purpose of circumventing the prohibition of smoking.

C. Exceptions

Smoking may be permitted for the traditional ceremonial activities of recognized cultural or religious groups but must be approved in advance by the Dean of Students or Associate Dean for Student Affairs.
